


The 5th Wave


The BFG (July 2016)


Miss Perigrine's Home for Peculiar Children

An unflinching, darkly funny, and deeply moving story of a boy, his seriously ill mother, and an unexpected monstrous visitor.






Let It Snow

Red Queen




The Darkest Minds




Looking for Alaska

Artemis Fowl



