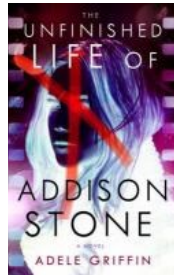
Double Helix

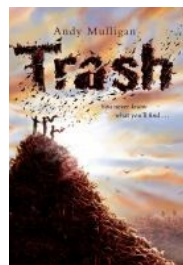
Jasper Jones

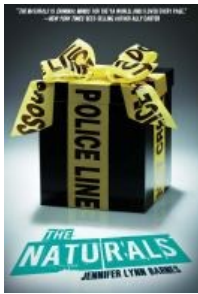
Draw the Dark

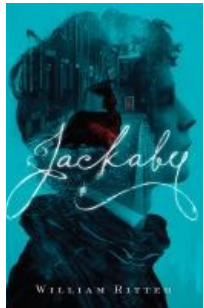
The Naturals

Seventeen-year-old Cassie, who has a natural ability to read people, joins an elite group of criminal profilers at the FBI in order to help solve cold cases.



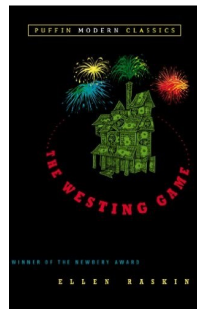
Girl, Stolen

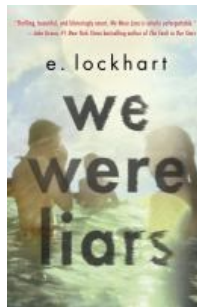
The Westing Game

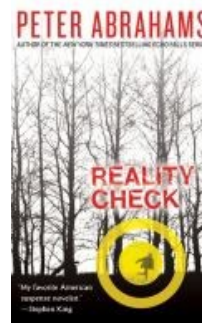
We Were Liars

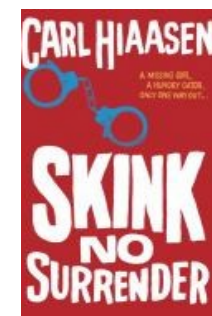
Paper Towns
