### SELECTED RECENT MUSIC ON HOOPLA

The best way to find music through Hoopla is to isolate the format (a drop down next to the search box) to music. Then, search by artist or album title or genre or even search terms like "Hispanic American."

### SELECTED STREAMING VIDEO ON HOOPLA & KANOPY (for Brighton residents)

There are numerous films and documentaries offered by both Hoopla and Kanopy. As their collections are ever changing, the easiest way to find videos is to use the search box functions of each service or to browse by collection or subject.

## Databases



**General OneFile** Find an article on almost any topic in Hispanic and Latinx American history. Go to [brightonlibrary.org](http://brightonlibrary.org), choose "Databases," then "News & Research," then "General One-File." Try typing keywords "Hispanic" or "Latin" to start; the database will offer related terms that may be useful in your search.

**Newsstand** Over 100 full-text newspapers in the Spanish language, including *CNN Wire Español* (2014-present) and *El Nuevo Día de Puerto Rico* (2006-present). Go to [brightonlibrary.org](http://brightonlibrary.org), choose "Databases," then "News & Research," then "Newsstand," then "Advanced Search," then "Publication Search." Finally, in the "Language of Publication" box, select "Spanish" and choose a newspaper from the list.

**NoveList Plus** is a resource for readers that is searchable by title, author, subject, and more. Go to [brightonlibrary.org](http://brightonlibrary.org), choose "Databases," then "Buying/Legal/Language," then "NoveList Plus." On the left side, under the reading lists heading, choose "All Kinds of Lives," then find *Latine Lives*, a list of autobiographies, memoirs, and biographies about Latino/Latina/Latine life experiences.

**Pronunciator** is an online language learning program that teaches practical conversation in 100+ languages. Learn any of these languages from home through self-directed lessons, live teachers, movies, music, and more. Go to [brightonlibrary.org](http://brightonlibrary.org), choose "Databases," then "Buying/Legal/Language," then "Pronunciator," then "Instant Access," and finally "Launch Pronunciator."
