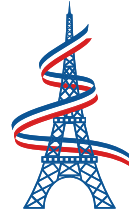

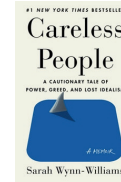
Meet teen lit contest winner Vivian in the Teen Center to chat about what you're working on, use writing prompts, and more. Open to grades 6-12. Registration required.

Learn about this influential woman in our three-part series about Eleanor Roosevelt. Presented by Monroe Community College History Professor, Mark Sample. Registration required.

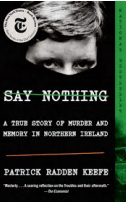


## ADULT PROGRAMS CONT.
